

Humane Ohio and Toledo's PET Bull Project

Join Forces to Feed Hungry Pets



The Humane Ohio Pet Food Bank has served for many years as a resource for pet parents in need of assistance due to difficult financial times. The goal of this program is to keep pets in their homes and out of overcrowded shelters. We do this by offering clients supplemental dog and cat food on a monthly basis.

This year Humane Ohio and Toledo's PET Bull Project combined resources to operate one pet food pantry. Both organizations had previously been conducting separate pet food banks just a mile and a half apart. This merger allowed the organizations to combine resources, and offer extended food bank hours in one centralized location to the community.

The updated Pet Food Pantry is held at the existing Toledo's PET Bull Project location, 2249 Tremainsville Rd. A huge perk of this location is that the food bank is conducted on the first floor to allow better access for clients who have difficulty with mobility. Additionally, young people from G.O.A.L., Green Options for Autism of Lucas County, take part in operating the Pet Food Pantry, helping them learn skills to ready them for the workforce, while helping their community.

We did a record number of spay/neuter surgeries this year - this was made possible only with the help of the community!

Humane Ohio fixed 5,006 outdoor cats in 2018 and provided advice and some hands on assistance with trapping, and loaned out live traps for catching stray cats to be fixed. We held our first ever “Feral Cats 101” training class this year to teach people more about community cats and ways we can help them.

Recently we held a family volunteer cat shelter build day where over 40 shelters were prepared for outdoor cats. Our youngest helpers decorated the inside of the shelters so the cats would have something enjoyable to look at!

Adoption Program Placed Over 350 Cats and Kittens This Year!

In our second year of the Humane Ohio adoption program we were able to place over 350 cats and kittens into new homes! We take cats into our program who are most in need, usually from an unsafe outdoor situation. This year the cats in our program included some who needed our help with amputations, eye removals, special placement due to Feline Leukemia, and more!
