

CareCredit Financing

CareCredit is a personal line of credit for healthcare treatments and procedures for your entire family, including veterinary services for your pets. CareCredit offers no interest if your balance is paid in full within the designated timeframe. (Minimum monthly payments must be made.)

CareCredit care be used not only for routine check-ups, but for emergencies or unplanned care. CareCredit can be used to pay for any or all of your pets' veterinary services from your puppy's emergency trip to the vet to a house-call visit for your horse. You can use the card for most procedures and items purchased at any veterinary facility that accepts CareCredit.

You can apply for CareCredit online and find out instantly if you are eligible for a CareCredit credit card account. From their website, you can also find a list of participating veterinary offices in your area that accept CareCredit.

Community Resources For Pet Owners



Community Resources

Several Toledo-area non-profit animal shelters and rescue organizations have gathered a list of services and resources available to pet owners in our community. Our goal is to inform pet owners who are facing financial hardships that there are services and resources, ranging from spay and neuter programs to pet food assistance, available to help. By providing resources for pet owners, during difficult times, we hope to keep more pets in loving homes. Toledo Area Humane Society

The Toledo Area Humane Society is a non-profit, open-door facility that takes in all animals, regardless of temperament, breed, age, health or space availability. TAHS's mission is to lead the community in efforts focused on relieving the suffering of, preventing cruelty to, and providing for humane treatment of animals. As part of that mission, TAHS works hard to keep pets with their families by offering a variety of resources to pet owners, including:

- A listing of pet-friendly mobile home parks and apartments in the Toledo area
- Temporary pet food assistance for low-income pet owners. Food assistance is only available once every six months per pet owner. Pet owners must show proof from their vet that their pet is spayed/neutered.
- On-going pet food support to low-income Mobile Meals clients. *(Must be a Mobile Meals client. Please contact Mobile Meals to make arrangements.)*
- The Behavior Helpline, a no-cost resource to answer questions and provide advice about pet behavior. Visit their website for a list of frequently asked about problems.
- With an increased number of foreclosures, more animals are being left behind when their family is forced to move. TAHS's cruelty officers respond to calls of abused, neglected, and abandoned animals within Lucas County. To report possible animal cruelty or abandonment, please call the TAHS Cruelty Hotline at 419-891-9777.
- TAHS offers the SAFE Place Program, a temporary safe haven for the pets of individuals/families who find themselves in an emergency situation, generally woman fleeing domestic violence situations.

Humane Ohio

Humane Ohio is a non-profit, low-cost spay and neuter clinic whose mission is to end dog and cat overpopulation in the Greater Toledo area by offering high-quality, affordable spay/neuter and promoting responsible pet care. Humane Ohio believes that all animals should receive the highest quality veterinary care possible, even if the services rendered are at a reduced cost. Humane Ohio serves any pet owner, free-roaming cat caretaker, animal shelter or rescue group in Northwest Ohio or Southeast Michigan. Please call even if you think you can't afford it; as a non-profit organization, Humane Ohio sometimes has private donations or grant money that they can use to reduce their cost even further.

Humane Ohio also runs spay/neuter specials throughout the year and reduces their normal low-cost rate even further for owned cats, free-roaming cats and pit bull-type dogs. In addition, to ensure that pets do not go hungry and that pet owners do not have to share their meals and go hungry themselves, Humane Ohio offers a pet food bank for pet parents and free-roaming cat caretakers in Lucas, Wood and Monroe Counties.

Planned Pethood, Inc.

Planned Pethood, Inc. is a non-profit animal rescue organization whose mission is to reduce the suffering and overpopulation of dogs and cats through education and low-cost spay and neuter programs. They also rescue, provide medical care for, and place adoptable dogs and cats into good, permanent homes. Planned Pethood also offers free spay/neutering for eligible pet owners in Lucas County, including those who receive:

- Medicaid
- MediPass
- Section 8 Public Housing
- Food Assistance
- Heat Assistance
- WIC
- Ohio Works First (OWF)
- Social Security Income (SSI)

Paws & Whiskers Cat Shelter

Paws & Whiskers is a non-profit, feline only, no-kill shelter specializing in the care and placement of felines in forever homes. Paws & Whiskers will accept cats, no questions asked, in the following situations:

- If the cat was adopted from Paws & Whiskers and the owner can no longer care for it
- If you are a member of the military and are being deployed (foster arrangements may be attempted if you would like your cat back upon your return home)
- Paws & Whiskers will accept cats from police or fire personnel dealing with emergency situations
- On a very limited basis, Paws & Whiskers will provide temporary boarding for a cat whose owner is between homes or looking for a place to stay. (This requires a \$5.00 per day boarding fee, paid two weeks in advance.)
- On a limited basis, Paws & Whiskers will provide supplies to an individual who is willing to bottle feed a stray litter of kittens without their mother.

Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet

Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet is a no-kill animal rescue organization with both a foster-based network and a shelter facility. Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet is founded on the belief that every companion animal deserves a loving, responsible and permanent home. Their mission is to leave no animal homeless, unloved, abused or neglected by educating the community about responsible pet ownership. In addition to providing pet behavioral counseling and referral services for all pet owners, Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet offers additional services for Lucas County residents facing financial challenges.

- Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet offers a low-cost spay/neuter program for pet owners currently facing financial difficulties, but who wish to still be responsible with their pet care.
- On a limited basis when funding is available, Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet offers the "Vet-A-Pet" Program to provide vet care to pets of low-income families.
- When supplies and donations are available, Maumee Valley Save-A-Pet also provides pet food assistance to low-income Lucas County residents.
